DOMESTIC STUDENTS

These fee tables summarize the fees for students admitted to the University of Toronto Scarborough (UTSC) including those who transferred from either the Faculty of Arts & Science (FAS) or University of Toronto Mississauga (UTM).

THESE FEE TABLES SUMMARIZE THE FOLLOWING FEES:

- 1 a) Program: Flat rate amount charged to all students in a program; there may be a full-time and/or part-time rate.
- 1 b) Course: Fees are assessed on a course by course basis. When a course is added, the course fee is charged immediately, regardless of when the course begins. When a course is cancelled, the course fee is reversed in accordance with the refund schedule applicable to the student's program. □
- 1 c) Minimum Charge: A minimum charge of \$256.00 will be charged to students who cancel his/her registration in the Fall or Winter semester in a program (degree or non-degree studies) on or after the published date for the first day of classes for the semester.
- 2) Incidental: Compulsory fees for campus and student services.
- 3) System Access: Fee for access to the Student Web Service (ROSI/SWS/ACORN). □
- 4) Ancillary: Fees for specific courses or programs are displayed in the Tuition Charges section of the ROSI/SWS/ACORN invoice.
- 5) University Health Insurance Plan (UHIP): UHIP is compulsory for all international students as well as recent permanent residents and returning Canadian citizens who are in their 3 month OHIP wait period. International students who have been exempted from UHIP must request this exemption every year at the UHIP office.

Fees Invoice and Payment

For academic purposes, University of Toronto at Scarborough operates on a trimester system:

- 1) Summer semester (May to August)
- 2) Fall semester (September to December)
- 3) Winter semester (January to April)

However, student fees are invoiced for two sessions, namely:

- 1) Fall-Winter session (September to April): The Fall-Winter session invoice summarizes both the Fall (September to December) semester & Winter (January to April) semester fees.
- 2) Summer session (May to August): The Summer session invoice summarizes the Summer semester fees.

New! Effective 2015 Fall - 2016 Winter session, students will have the option to pay fees:

- a) on a sessional basis (both Fall and Winter together) by the Fall term fee payment deadline, or
- b) by term (separate Fall and Winter term payments) as per the new fee payment and monthly service charge billing schedules that can be viewed at www.fees.utoronto.ca or by clicking on the Guide to Reading Your Invoice and Invoice FAQs link on the online invoice.

All fees and charges posted to the ROSI/SWS/ACORN account are payable when billed. Students are responsible for planning sufficient time for payments to reach the University's bank account and to be recorded in the student's SWS/ROSI account by the payment due date. The transfer of funds from major Canadian financial institutions normally takes three to five business days, however the transfer from Canadian credit unions and financial institutions from outside Canada can take much longer.

Paper invoices are not routinely mailed. Students are expected to monitor their account on the ROSI/SWS/ACORN at: www.rosi.utoronto.ca Non-receipt of an invoice does not exempt the student from meeting his/her financial obligations.

Service Charges

Any outstanding account balance is subject to a monthly service charge of 1.5% compounded (19.56% per annum) as per the new fee payment and monthly service charge billing schedules that can be viewed at www.fees.utoronto.ca or by clicking on the Guide to Reading Your Invoice and Invoice FAQs link on the online invoice.
